The Governor Bedford and the Richard McWilliam houses: #6, now owned by Mrs. Jennie K. Garrison, #8 now owned by the heirs of George and Elizabeth Stahl McIntire.
- 0-3
Justa Andries
66'-4"
The McIntire Garden and #14, the Morrison house. The garden now owned by the heirs of James Morrison: Mrs. Bessie Wilson and Mrs. Mary Denny.

George More
63'
The Morrison Garden and the Presbyterian Manse, #20.
- 0-5
Sender Fenix
50'
The present #22 and #24 with the alley between. #22 owned by Peter G. Madden; #24 owned by Myrtle Booker Maguire.
- 0-6
Andries Hudde
Originally 60' -
but 0-5 later overlapped,
leaving it about 41'
The present #26 and #28 on the Dutch Church lot. #26 owned by Lilburne A. Marton; #28 owned by Rudolph Goepf Jr. and Eliza W. Goepf.

Jan Andriesen
60'
The present Dungan house, #30, the 4½ foot alley on the north side and 35 feet of the Bead garden adjoining. House #30, owned by Miss Ann J. Dungan; garden part by Philip Laird.

60 feet of the present Read garden adjoining the 35 feet that originally belonged to 0-7. Now owned by Philip Laird.

Poppe Jansen
60'
The remainder of the Bead garden and 32 feet of the building site of the Read house. #42, now owned by Philip Laird.

0-10
William Maurits
63'
The remainder of the ground on which the Read house stands, 17 feet, and the adjoining 46 feet including the alley and part of the garden of present #54. The garden owned by Lesley V. George.

0-11
William Maurits
60'
The remainder of the present garden of #54 and the site of the house #54 which includes the site of the Tile House. Now owned by Lesley V. George.

The site of present #56, the Dr. James McCallmont house, now owned by _____? #58, now owned by Lillie and Frances Rees. #60 the Immanuel Church Parish House.
