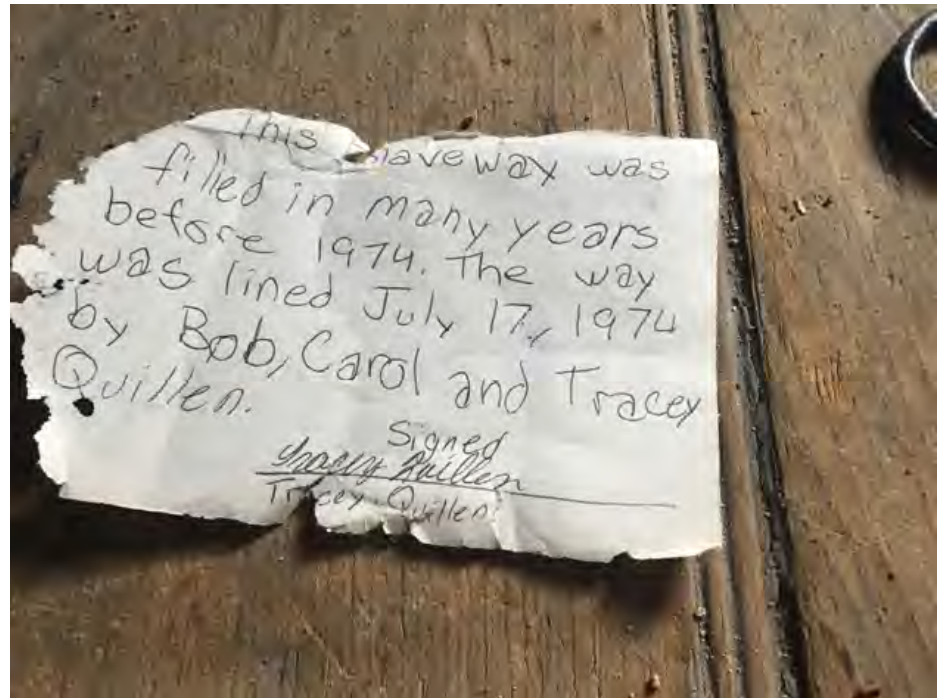

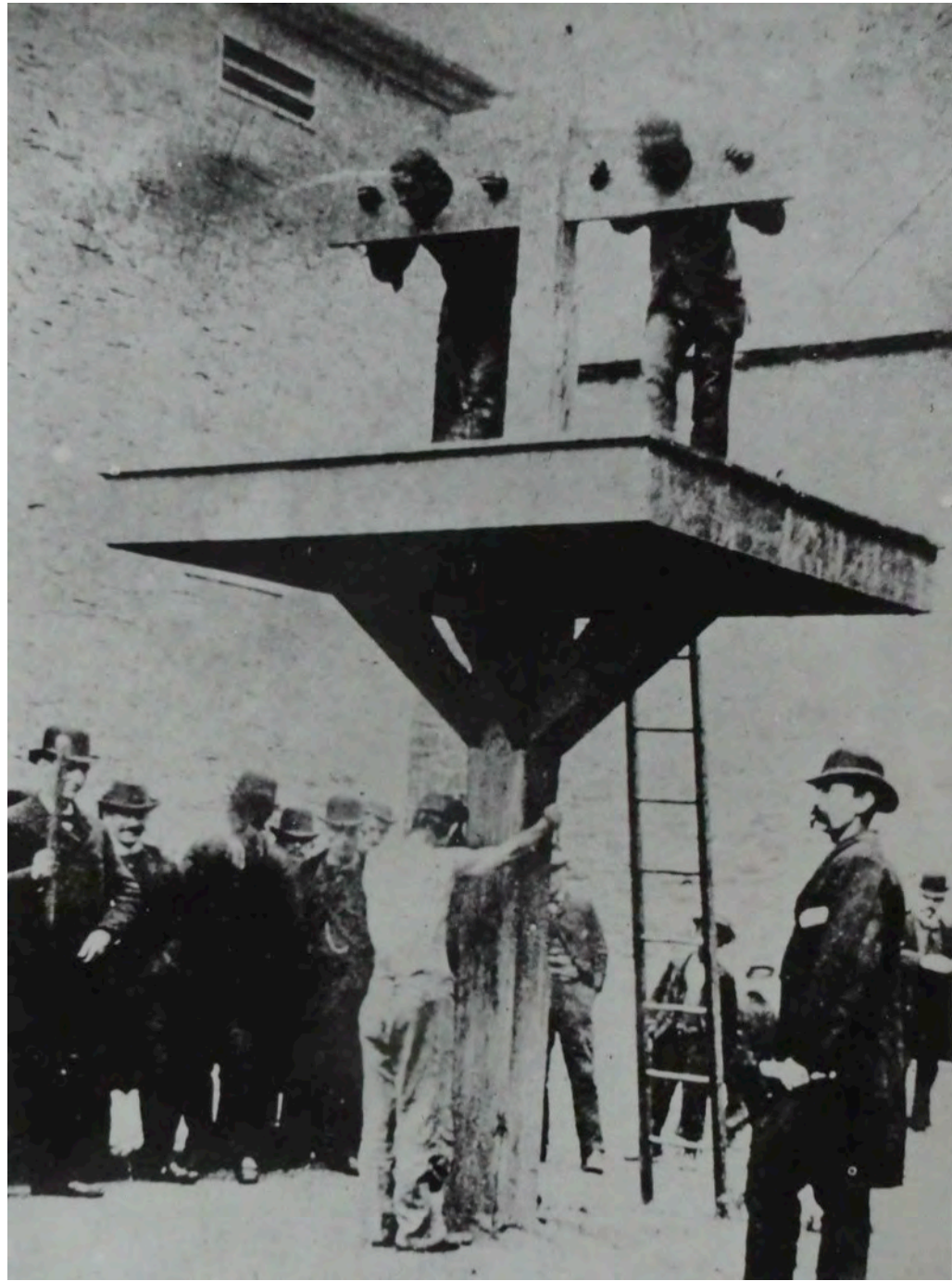

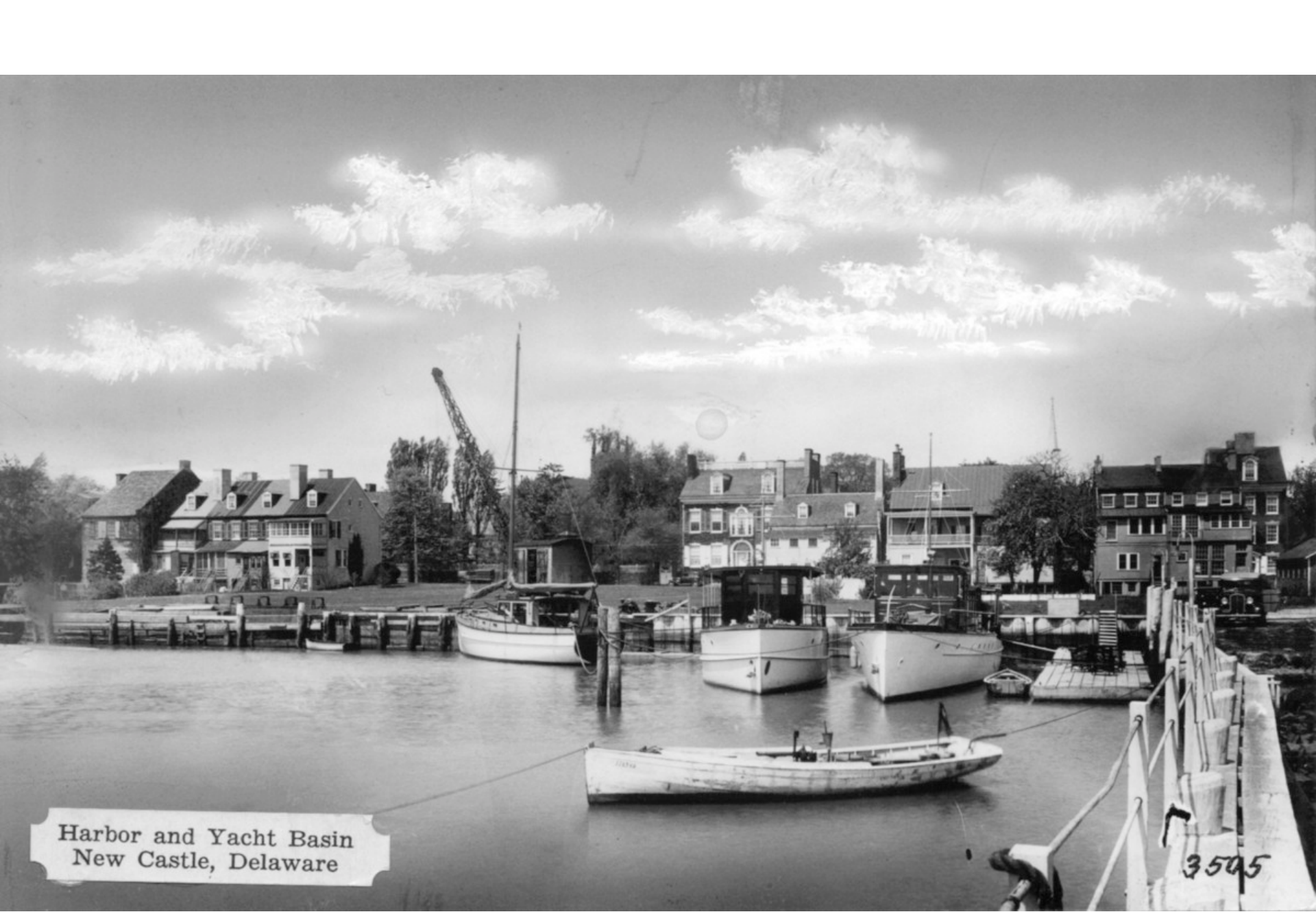






A Harbor at NEW CASTLE, Delaware.
